



A Note from the Director:

F***ed Up Fairytales is a modern retelling of some classic Grimm fairytales. For me, fairytales have always been about the universal human emotions we experience in the face of animosity. Often in fairytales (and in life) "f***ed up" things happen seemingly without rhyme or reason. This year has been exceptional in the sheer amount of animosity that we have all been facing: illness and job loss among a global pandemic, the unjust loss of black lives due to police brutality, extreme political unrest, bushfires, floods, locust swarms - just to name a few. In times of animosity, the resilience of humankind shines through. In this show, each fairytale in has its own unique themes, but the through line is that, despite everything being a little "f***ed up," we are all in this together. Were it not for each other, we would have never been so resilient. A stronger sense of community has been one of the most beautiful things to come out of this year - and I'll definitely drink to that.
