

Holly Hepp-Galván (Playwright) Holly Hepp-Galván lives in New York City where she was recently named a runner-up in the 2021 Jackie White National Memorial Playwriting Contest and was a 2019 NYSCA/NYFA Fellow in Playwriting/Screenwriting. Holly's plays have been presented at or developed with Project Y Theatre Company, New Perspectives Theatre Company, Core Artist Ensemble, New Circle Theatre Company, The Bechdel Group, Wide-Eyed Productions, The New York International Fringe Festival, 52nd Street Project, and more. She is Playwright-in-Residence for Voices Inside/Out, a playwriting program for incarcerated individuals and also currently serves on the faculty of Baruch College and Fordham University where she teaches undergraduate and graduate courses in Journalism, Playwriting, Creative Dramatics, and Theatre for Youth.

JUDD LEAR SILVERMAN (playwright) spent many years at Henry Street Settlement's Abrons Arts Center, teaching playwriting, coordinating the Urban Youth Theater, and producing/directing productions for children and teens. He ran an afterschool program at the Harlem Children's Zone, another for a Manhattan middle school, and counseled students and coordinated productions for Brooklyn College's Theater Department, prior to which he worked for numerous stage and film producers, directors, and agents. Recipient of a Berrilla Kerr Foundation playwriting grant, he is published by Samuel French, Stage It!, and Best American Short Plays among others. Recently, his work was seen virtually via Rising Sun, Michigan's Bay City Players, Florida's Phoenix Tears Productions, and soon Massachusetts' Jakespeare VTC. He teaches playwriting, drama lit, and composition at Pace University.

Anel Carmona (Director) thrilled to direct Playing Possum! She is a Multidisciplinary Theatre Artist and Educator. Originally from Mexico and based in New York City, Anel has taken part in dozens of productions throughout North America. She has been on staff at Dance Entropy, Form Theatricals, The Book of Merman, The Play Company and Drunk Shakespeare. She is a recipient of the New York Innovative Theatre Awards "Founders Award" for her contributions to the organization and Off-Off Broadway Community and Two Time "Congeniality" and "Outstanding Director" Award Winner from the Planet Connections Theatre Festival. She is an anti-sexual harassment advocate and the founder of "creating safe spaces"- the first theatrical based anti-harassment training program in the US.
